**Fall Educational Seminar Series**

**Clean Water 101, will be held Sept. 13.** It will focus on the current state of waters in Lancaster County and where we need to be, the basics of clean water standards, how streams are assessed, the total maximum daily loads our streams can endure and survive or not survive, and goals for returning our streams to a healthy status.

**Clean Water 201, which will be held on Oct. 11,** will include peer reviews. Local officials will have the opportunity to review the progress they are making on clean water projects in their municipalities and exchange their plans with each other. This seminar will promote a sharing of information between the officials.

**Clean Water 301 will be held on Nov. 8** and will present answers on how to start a Source Water Protection program in a municipality. Municipalities have the resources and manpower to help, so officials should take advantage of this opportunity.
